# **CALVARY CRC AND COMMUNION**

This past month, the Calvary Consistory approved a document called "Calvary CRC and the Sacrament Communion" for use in our ministry. You can find this document at the end of this Proclaimer article—be sure to check it out!

As you'll see, the document is only one page long and it doesn't change anything about what we believe or how we practice communion.

The document was created to help Calvary more clearly communicate to new members, potential new members, and regular attendees some basic matters of value and practice related to the sacrament. We are hopeful this document helps Calvary more faithfully utilize communion for our covenantal discipleship.

While there are certainly things we want to communicate clearly to potential members about the sacrament, the Consistory also wanted to remind our Editorial by Nick Van Beek Lead Pastor pastornick@ calvarycrc.net



membership of several important aspects of communion.

First, for parents, there is a special responsibility to disciple children in the context of communion. Even though we ask children who have not made profession of faith not to partake of the sacrament, there is a responsibility for parents to teach their children about the sacrament and why it is important for our faith and life. We invite parents to engage their children in conversations about communion often, teaching them the meaning of the elements and their connection to Christ's sacrifice, the importance of faith, and the importance of being unified to Christ and his community.

Communion is an outward, physical sign of God's inward, invisible grace to us. This is a big, powerful truth that is simple enough for children to understand.

Second, for all members, it is good to be reminded of the importance of being physically present for communion as much as possible. The sacrament of communion is best taken in community; it not only unifies us to Christ and his physical body in heaven, but also to his body, the church. As a covenant community, we walk the journey of faith together and taking the sacrament together as a body is an important aspect of making this journey together.

Third, for all members there is a responsibility of self-examination. In 1 Corinthians 11, Paul speaks about the importance of selfexamination before partaking of communion. There is value in examining our faith and practice in conjunction with the sacrament. While we will continue to explicitly mention communion in the Prayer of Confession the week before communion as part of this self-examination, we invite all members to engage in their own selfexamination as Paul instructs us.

Thanks for taking the time to review the document and may we continue to be faithful in our discipleship through the sacrament of communion!

# Calvary CRC and The Sacrament of Communion

Churches from different traditions and denominations often have different practices and priorities related to the Sacrament of Communion. This document seeks to communicate our values and priorities as a local Christian Reformed Church.

- We welcome to the table all those who have publicly professed faith in Jesus' death and resurrection as a means of grace and salvation from sin and death.
- We welcome to the table all those from other traditions and denominations who have put their faith in Jesus as Savior and Lord and who are full members in good standing at a Christcentered Church.
- We welcome to the table those with disabilities who have made an ability-appropriate profession of faith.
- We invite covenant children who have not made Profession of Faith to come forward during communion to receive a blessing from the pastor.
- We invite parents to faithfully teach their children the meaning and practice of the sacrament and the importance of it for our faith and life.
- We invite children and parents to discuss the journey of faith and if/when it is time for a child to make a public profession of faith. Calvary welcomes children to make Profession of Faith as young as eight years old.
- We encourage all those who have made a public Profession of Faith to examine themselves in life and faith before partaking in communion.
- We encourage all those who have not yet publicly professed their faith in Christ to consider doing so.
- We encourage all Calvary members to be present with the covenant community for communion as often as possible.



# Making Disciples of Christ in Edina Public Schools

My wife, Hannah, is a middle school math teacher at Valley View Middle School in Edina. She cares for her students and knows many of them are going through family problems, high anxiety, and questions about their identity. Hannah was hoping to share the gospel of Jesus with them so they could experience the peace and purpose of knowing the Good Shepherd.

Two years ago, Troy Beckman, a teacher at South View Middle School, was leading a Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA) before school on Fridays. He was hoping local churches could become more involved with the FCA. He searched online, saw we are a Christ-centered church and reached out to me. After meeting with Troy at his FCA, I told Hannah about my experience. Hannah decided she wanted to start an FCA at her school.

With Troy's guidance, Hannah found a student leader and received approval from the principal. She asked me to make Bible studies for the group. We decided the gospel of John would be a good book to study with students from many different backgrounds and spiritual maturity. Before the first Friday of FCA, I asked Hannah, "How many Bible studies should I print?"

"Maybe 10?" Hannah replied. "I hope some kids come!" When she got to school on Friday, there were 30 kids waiting for the FCA! They ate donuts, Hannah led the Bible study on John 1, and they finished with a short game in the gym. Hannah was exhausted after managing that many kids, but very fulfilled and excited about the discipleship. The Edina parents' prayer group that found out about the new FCA and spread the word. I meet with local youth pastors once a month so I told them about the FCA and encouraged them to tell their students about it.

Since then, the group has grown to 40 to 50 and now 60 kids! A few teachers of the school who are Christians but were hesitant to start a group, now joyfully help out with the FCA. Hannah encourages the students to bring their friends to FCA, and they do! She has seen so many new faces this year. Her FCA meets every Friday morning before school and is a unique ministry opportunity for the students.

The FCA will study every chapter of John by the end of the year. Hannah facilitates wonderful discussions about the identity of Jesus, the seven I Am statements, the eight miraculous signs, the work of the Holy Spirit, the command to love each other, and the crucifixion and resurrection of Christ. Many of the students ask good questions and share their heart for the Lord. Some students attend churches and some do not. Hannah is able to encourage believers in their faith and share the gospel with students seeking the truth.

All students are invited to FCA, they don't have to be an athlete to attend. FCA has good name recognition and the national organization provides good structure and accountability for all the FCA groups. A few times this year, FCA reps have come to encourage Hannah and hand out bracelets to the students.

Sometimes, Blakely, Reuben, and I come to see all the excitement of FCA at Hannah's school. Blakely usually plays with toys under Hannah's desk and Reuben is walking around grabbing kids' water bottles!

Praise God for this amazing opportunity! Please pray the students will grow in their Christian faith, that Hannah will be filled with wisdom on how to lead, and more students will come hear the gospel through FCA.

#### Where do you work?

I have worked for US Bank in some position related to Business Banking for 28 years. I started as a Business Banker in Sioux Falls, SD. Like many others, I was in a very long job transition during the pandemic. It was a difficult time but also a time to grow spiritually – to rely on God like in Matthew 6:26. This week, my manager wants me to lead an R&D project and a non-profit organization just offered me to chair one of their committees. Three years ago I didn't see these things coming. God's timing is unique and that's why we shouldn't compare ourselves to others. At the end of the day we all have our comeback stories to share.

#### Are your co-workers Christians? Have you had opportunities to talk to them about what they believe? Have you been able to share your faith in Christ with them?

Some of my coworkers and those that work for me are Christians. To reflect on the previous question...I often have had opportunities to talk to them about my faith because of the calmness they see in me when something challenging is going on. I often will get a question asking me why I am not stressed out on something based on my response. I state I am still stressed but I know my God is in control and that my faith in Him gives me that unmoveable peace. Often I am able to expound on that. Even this past month I was able to talk to one of the top leaders in our company about how we shared this same view of life with our faith as our foundation and that has invigorated me further to be more bold in my testimony on a daily basis. I feel as I get older I am more and more comfortable at work to see it as much as a mission field as a place to drive revenue.
